

SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT ADMINISTRATION

AMENDED AND RESTATED INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT

NOW KNOWN AS THE AUCILLA AREA SOLID WASTE ADMINISTRATION

This Amendment to the AUCILLA AREA SOLID WASTE ADMINISTRATION INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT is made and entered into this 31st day of January, 1999 by and between Dixie County, a political subdivision of the State of Florida; Jefferson County, a political subdivision of the State of Florida; and Taylor County, a political subdivision of the State of Florida; as the "Counties."

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Counties entered into an INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT creating the SUWANNEE VALLEY SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT ADMINISTRATION on May 23, 1988; and

WHEREAS, the Counties subsequently amended and restated that agreement in the SUWANNEE VALLEY SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT ADMINISTRATION AMENDED AND RESTATED INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT which was dated June 1, 1991; and

WHEREAS, the counties amended the SUWANNEE VALLEY SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT ADMINISTRATION AMENDED AND RESTATED INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT on June 15, 1992 in an amendment entitled AMENDMENT TO THE SUWANNEE VALLEY SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT ADMINISTRATION AMENDED AND RESTATED

INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT which amendment changed the name of the SUWANNEE VALLEY SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT ADMINISTRATION to AUCILLA AREA SOLID WASTE ADMINISTRATION; and

WHEREAS, the counties amended the previously adopted INTERLOCAL AGREEMENTS and Amendments thereto in an Amendment titled the SECOND AMENDMENT TO THE SUWANNEE VALLEY SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT ADMINISTRATION AMENDED AND RESTATED INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT NOW KNOWN AS THE AUCILLA AREA SOLID WASTE ADMINISTRATION on July 17, 1995 which amendment dealt with the equalization of transportation costs; and

WHEREAS, the AUCILLA AREA SOLID WASTE ADMINISTRATION, together with the counties, wish to change the provision in the INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT which deals with solid waste which is not generated within the region; and

WHEREAS, the Administration, together with the counties, agree that by accepting solid waste which has not been generated within the region that there will be substantial financial savings to the individual counties; and

WHEREAS, the Administration, together with the counties wish to change the provisions in the Interlocal Agreement which deals with the equalization of transportation costs in order to take advantage of financial savings from acceptance of solid waste not generated within the region.

NOW THEREFORE, for in consideration of the mutual benefits to flow to the counties and the citizens residing in each of the counties, and in consideration of the mutual covenants, promises and agreements herein contained, the counties hereby agree with each other as follows:

1. AUCILLA AREA SOLID WASTE ADMINISTRATION together with the counties hereby delete Section 11, paragraph B of SUWANNEE VALLEY SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT ADMINISTRATION AMENDED AND RESTATED INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT found on page 26 of that document and substitute for that provision the following language which will now be the new paragraph 11B of the SUWANNEE VALLEY SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT ADMINISTRATION AMENDED AND RESTATED INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT which organization, pursuant to a subsequent Amendment is now known as AUCILLA AREA SOLID WASTE ADMINISTRATION. The language is as follows:

It is in the best interests of the counties to accept solid waste which has been generated outside the region. The Administration is authorized to accept without the approval of the host county up to 700 tons per day, as a daily average, of solid waste generated outside of the region. The Administration is prohibited from accepting any solid waste generated outside of the region in excess of 700 tons per day, as a daily average, without obtaining the express written approval of the host county. The host county will be entitled to a tipping fee of \$1.00 per ton of any solid waste generated outside the region which is accepted by the Administration. The tipping fee of \$1.00 per ton to the host county as hereinabove set forth shall not be further modified except by unanimous vote of all participating counties.

AUCILLA AREA SOLID WASTE ADMINISTRATION, together with the counties, hereby delete Section 11, paragraph d of SUWANNEE VALLEY SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT ADMINISTRATION AMENDED AND RESTATED INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT, modified by amendment titled the "SECOND AMENDMENT TO THE SUWANNEE VALLEY SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT ADMINISTRATION AMENDED AND RESTATED INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT" NOW KNOWN AS THE AUCILLA AREA SOLID WASTE ADMINISTRATION dated July 17, 1995, and substitute for that provision the following language which will now be the new paragraph 11D of the SUWANNEE VALLEY SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT ADMINISTRATION AMENDED AND RESTATED INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT which organization, pursuant to a subsequent Amendment is now known as the AUCILLA AREA SOLID WASTE ADMINISTRATION. The language is as follows:

It is in the best interests of the counties to equalize transportation cost for each individual county except for Madison County, which has not participated in the equalization formula because it is the host county. Moreover, it is in the best interest of the counties to provide a means to reduce the equalization transportation costs paid by Taylor County and Jefferson County to Dixie County, in the event there is a decrease in tipping fees that may be realized by all of the counties as a result of the acceptance of solid waste generated outside of the region. The transportation costs as of September 1, 1994 were 0.25 per ton-mile. This transportation cost will be increased by the lesser of the increase in the Consumer Price Index as determined by the United States Government, or by three percent (3%). The initial increase in transportation costs occurred on September 1, 1997. Taylor and Jefferson Counties will each contribute money to Dixie County at the each of each fiscal year pursuant to the following formula:

Except as specifically amended by this document, all provisions of the SUWANNEE VALLEY SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT ADMINISTRATION AMENDED AND RESTATED INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT dated June 1, 1991 and the AMENDMENT TO THE SUWANNEE VALLEY SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT ADMINISTRATION AMENDED AND RESTATED INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT dated June 15, 1992 and the SECOND AMENDMENT TO THE SUWANNEE VALLEY SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT ADMINISTRATION AMENDED AND RESTATED INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT KNOW KNOWN AS THE AUCILLA AREA SOLID WASTE ADMINISTRATION DATED JULY 17, 1995, shall remain in full force and effect.
